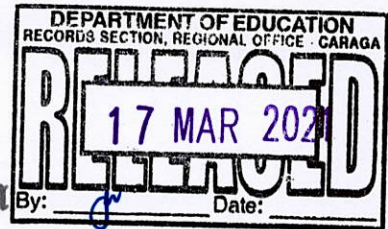

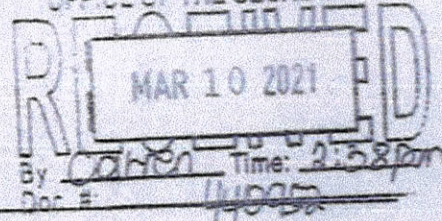

In partnership with the United States Embassy in the Philippines Regional English Language Office, the Department of Education through the National Educators Academy of the Philippines, is conducting *Teaching Grammar Communicatively in the Philippines* professional development initiative to be held in closed Zoom groups for 3,698 supervisors, head teachers, and master teachers starting March 22, 2021 until May 6, 2021.
2. This is a NEAP-recognized program and is integrated in the professional development program of NEAP.
3. This webinar series for supervisors and teachers aim to:
 - describe the Communicative Language Teaching (CLT) approach in relationship to language acquisition and how they inform the characteristics of Teaching grammar Communicatively.
 - use the Form-Meaning-Use (FMU) framework to identify relevant grammar features, and present grammar with selected activities.
 - explain why and how to integrate grammar into Skills lessons.
 - identify and evaluate errors and use a variety of feedback and error correction techniques.
 - create a communicative grammar lesson using a template.

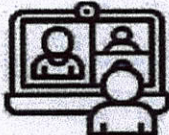
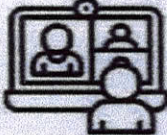

Annex 1: Selection Criteria for Participants

A. Webinar Series

Selection Criteria for Regional and SDO Supervisors

- Must be a National Educators Academy of the Philippines (NEAP) Certified Learning Facilitator; or Office of the Curriculum and Instruction (OUCI) National English Trainer
- Must be a designated Regional, Division or District English Supervisor
- Must be an English language specialist
- Must have a strong or capable internet connection for the synchronous online sessions
- Must express willingness to supervise, coach and mentor trainees in their respective regions and divisions
- must ensure that the all regional, division, and school participants will complete the program

Selection Criteria for Head Teachers

- Must have served/ designated head teacher of the English Department for five (5) years or more
- Must be a NEAP Certified Learning Facilitator; or Office of the Curriculum and Instruction (OUCI) National English Trainer
- Must be a designated Head Teacher of a Grade 7-10 or Secondary School
- Must be an English language specialist
- Must have a strong or capable internet connection for the synchronous online sessions

Selection Criteria for Master Teachers (Junior High School Grade 7 to 10)

- Must be designated as a master teacher in the JHS (Grade 7-10) for five (5) year or more
- Must be a NEAP Certified Learning Facilitator; or Office of the Curriculum and Instruction (OUCI) National English Trainer
- Must be an English language specialist
- Must have a strong or capable internet connection for the synchronous online sessions

B. Cascading Activities of the Webinar Trainees

Selection Criteria for the 25 (Junior High School/Grade 7 to 10) Teachers to be trained by the Webinar Participants

- Must be a JHS (Grade 7-10) Teacher of English or five (5) year or more
- Must be an English language specialist
- Must have a strong or capable internet connection for the synchronous online sessions

- identify and create a relevant context and create a communicative grammar task.
4. Regional offices are expected to identify interested and qualified participants who can complete the 6-week webinar series and re-echo the acquired knowledge and skills to fellow teachers through Learning Action Cells. Identified participants are requested to confirm their participation using their DepEd email address at <http://bit.ly/depeditgcip> until March 18, 2021. Facebook accounts will be requested for the sole purpose of the private Facebook Group as a supplemental discussion board for questions and answers.
 5. Given the time difference with the international English language specialists, the closed-online synchronized sessions via Zoom are scheduled at 6:00PM-8:00PM Philippine Time.
