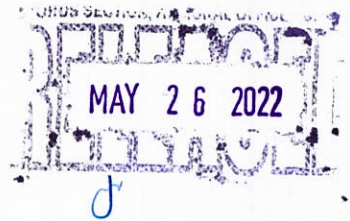

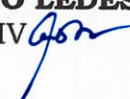

DISSEMINATION OF RDRRMC MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 078, S. 2022
RE: ONSET OF THE RAINY SEASON

1. This office disseminates to all Schools Division Offices the copy of the RDRRMC MC No. 078, s. 2022, pertaining to the onset of rainy season in the Caraga Region.
2. All SDOs are directed to monitor the schools for landslides, flashfloods, and damages in school facilities due to continuous heavy rainfall. Schools shall have to conduct preparedness and response interventions for the possible effects of the hazards as well as coordinate with LGUs for any announcement of class/work suspension and weather forecast/advisories by the local DRRMOs.
3. All schools shall also be on alert for a RADaR notification via SMS (sent to the registered school mobile phone no.) should the LGU be exposed to possible hazards. Upon receipt of RADaR notification, schools shall have to accomplish the link for reporting of damage assessment to include the use of schools as evacuation centers.
4. SDOs shall ensure that the School Heads and DRRM Coordinators are familiar with the online RADaR Tool specially those who are newly promoted or designated assigned in the most frequently affected areas.

The presence of Frontal System and the occurrence of severe thunderstorms have brought widespread rains during the last five days in areas under Type I climate and other parts of the country. Moreover, Southwesterly Windflow was also observed during the past few days. This satisfies the criteria of the start of the rainy season over the western sections of Luzon and Visayas.

Intermittent rains, associated with the Southwest (SW) monsoon will start to affect Metro Manila and the western sections of the country. However, breaks in rainfall events (also known as monsoon breaks), which can last for several days or weeks may still occur.

Meanwhile, the ongoing La Niña may still affect some parts of the country, which may increase the likelihood of above normal rainfall conditions in the coming months. In this regard, amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, all concerned government agencies and the public are advised to take the following preparedness measures:

• Undertake risk-informed decision making. • Undertake Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) and other related meetings as needed. • Undertake resource inventory and stockpiling as NDRRMC Response Clusters.	• Undertake and implement science and evidence-based decisions within your areas of responsibility (AOR) in the conduct of Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment. • Prepare critical facilities and services. • Maximize the Local DRRM Funds. • Increase capabilities for logistics requirements. • Adhere to the LISTO Protocol of DILG.

General Public	Non-government Organizations, Civil Society Organizations, Private Sector and Other Partner Stake Holders
• Monitor the news and authorized government sources for weather updates, warning and advisories. • Check and prepare "Go Bags". • Stockpile goods at home.	• Coordinate with LGUs for prepositioning of resources and other preparedness activities.
