Subject : **Preemptive Advisory for Typhoon "Ompong"**



Attached herewith are the PAGASA 24-Hour Weather Forecast issued at 4:00am and NDRMC Advisory issued at 8:00am, Today, September 14, 2018 for the reference of Division Offices and Schools in relation to Typhoon Ompong.

In connection to the above, all Schools Division Offices and Heads of Public and Private Schools are hereby reminded to ensure that the following preparedness measures are acted upon, to wit:

- all computers and other electrical equipment are unplugged; and,
- textbooks, school records, furniture and other important materials are moved to safe areas,
- with the help of the communities, secure the roof beams with wires and heavy duty ropes,
- board-up жалousies and windows with plywood or other secure material,
- prune trees especially those adjacent to buildings and along electrical posts; and secure all on-going construction projects including supplies and materials.

For schools that may be designated as Evacuation Centers, School Heads should immediately contact their respective Division Offices via text message and identify the School Coordinator and contact details.

All DRRM Coordinators must stay alert and monitor the effects of Typhoon Ompong while SDSs/ASDs are requested to report their whereabouts and conditions to their Division DRRM Coordinators every 8:00am and 5:00pm. All SDSs/ASDs are also advised to coordinate with their Local DRRMO on class suspensions, resumptions and other information concerning the schools.

Should there be damages incurred in schools/offices related to Typhoon Ompong, a consolidated division report must be submitted to the Central Office thru DRRMS copy furnish the Regional Office using the prescribed **Rapid Assessment of Damages Report (RADaR) Template**. The School DRRM Coordinators may also send an immediate text message using the RADaR Format to DRRMO thru mobile phone nos. 0928-871-8053/0915-205-3244.

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

TYPHOON "OMPONG" INCREASES ITS THREAT OVER NORTHERN LUZON AS IT MOVES CLOSER.

- Occasional rains and gusty winds will be experienced over the areas under TCWS #1.
- Stormy weather is expected over areas under TCWS#2 and TCWS#3.
- TY "OMPONG" is expected to make landfall in Cagayan-Isabela area on tomorrow early morning (Saturday, September 15).
- The Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) enhanced by the typhoon will bring moderate to occasionally heavy rains over Visayas while scattered light to moderate to at times heavy rains over Palawan, Zamboanga Peninsula, Northern Mindanao and Caraga.
- Residents in these areas, especially those living near river channels, in low-lying areas and in mountainous areas, are advised to take appropriate actions against those possible flooding and landslides, coordinate with local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and to continue monitoring for updates.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the seaboards of areas with TCWS and the eastern seaboards of Visayas and Mindanao.

Location of eye/center:	At 7:00 AM today, the eye of Typhoon "OMPONG" was located based on all available data at 605 km East of Baler, Aurora (15.7°N, 127.2°E).
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 205 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 255 km/h .
Movement:	Moving West Northwest at 20 km/h
Forecast Positions:	• 24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): In the vicinity of Peñablanca, Cagayan (17.6°N, 122.2°E). • 48 Hour (Sunday morning): 430 km West Northwest Laoag City, Ilocos Norte (OUTSIDE PAR) (19.3°N, 116.7°E). • 72 Hour (Monday morning): 1,205 km West of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (21.2°N, 110.4°E). • 96 Hour (Tuesday morning): 1,800 km West of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (21.8°N, 104.7°E).

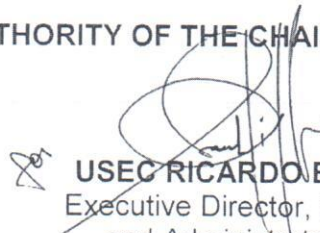

It is moving West Northwest at 20 km/h. Southwest monsoon affecting Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao.
