The Gender Mainstreaming Evaluation Framework (GMEF) considers Enabling Mechanism as one of the indicators of the Gender Mainstreaming (GM) level of the agency. The Philippine Commission on Women (PCW) encourages all GFPS members, secretariat and other personnel working on Gender Mainstreaming to be capacitated on Gender and Development as lead implementers of the agency.

As per initial profiling and needs assessment of the above-mentioned personnel, majority are in need of more focused trainings on Gender and Development. Many of them were given responsibilities that require more advanced trainings like GAD Planning and Budgeting, appreciation and application of Harmonized Gender and Development Guidelines (HGDG) and GMEF. The lack of proper understanding and internalization of the basic knowledge of Gender and Development Program and its tools, made it difficult for the concerned personnel to mainstream GAD in all PAPS of the agency. More so, the need to capacitate these personnel is necessary for an effective dissemination and application of the Gender Responsive Basic Education Policy (D.O. # 32 S., 2017) from RO, SDO to the Schools.

In this connection, DepEd- Caraga Region XIII finds it very timely that the Miriam College, Women and Gender Institute, an acclaimed service provider of capability building on Gender and Development, informs and invites us to avail of the short courses they are offering on the scheduled dates and at certain training cost (please see attachments).

All members of the GAD Focal Point System and their alternates, GAD Secretariat, GAD Coordinators and Youth Formation Coordinators are enjoined to avail of these trainings according to their felt need. The Youth Formation Coordinators, however, are encouraged to take the course on Gender Fair Education; and Gender, Sexuality and Youth/ Student Well Being.

WAGI MID-YEAR TRAINING INSTITUTE

For government officers and staff, NGO workers, professionals, activists, community workers, and graduate students

IWHRG

June 18-22, 2018

International Women's Human Rights and Governance

Running on its 19th year, IWHRG is among the longest standing academic-based women's human rights courses offered in the Philippines. The course critically discusses the use of international human rights instruments from a gender and rights perspectives. It focuses on analyzing complex issues of discrimination, inequality and oppression brought about by the intersection of structural and identity factors, such as, class, gender, ethnicity, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, among others. Participants are exposed to a diverse and interdisciplinary set of resource-speakers with years of engagement in national and international advocacy work on gender, human rights and governance.

Course Fee: Php 12,000

Gender Responsive Planning and Budgeting

The gender and development (GAD) budgeting process secures financial support for activities promoting gender equality and women's empowerment. Financial support, while necessary, must be complemented by strengthened organizational capacity for successful planning and implementation. The course will introduce the theories and practice of GAD budgeting in the Philippines, in line with PCW-NEDA-DBM Joint Circular No. 2012-01 and PCW-DILG-DBM-NEDA Joint Circular No. 2016-01 on GAD Plans and Budgets and Accomplishments in implementing Magna Carta of Women. The training approach will use case studies and the in depth sharing of participants' experiences to enhance learning.

Course Fee: Php 14,000

GFE

July 2-6, 2018

Gender Fair Education

GFE is a foundational course that introduces basic concepts in Gender and Development (GAD). It is designed for educators and development practitioners (i.e. teachers, trainers, module writers, etc.) in formal and non-formal educational settings. The course introduces the human rights and gender based perspectives in schools, communities, and other teaching-learning settings. Topics include education as human rights, gender fair language, gender mainstreaming in the curriculum, and the effective implementation of GAD mandates in education institutions and development organizations. The training sessions make use of interactive, hands-on approaches to enhance learning-by-doing.

Course Fee: Php 12,000

GSSYW

July 11-13, 2018

Gender, Sexuality, and Student-Youth Wellbeing

This new course offering is based on the increasing need to better understand and address the gender related issues that young people confront in these times. The course is designed to equip teachers, administrators, guidance counsellors, community youth organizers, social workers and youth related organizations, to better support youth wellbeing through a critical understanding of their gender practices. It provides an in depth appreciation of young people's views of gendered social expectations and their ways of coping. The course is directed at providing participants with a holistic understanding of the support young people need to feel safe and secure regardless of their gender and sexuality. The topics include gender issues of the youth related to mental health, addressing gender discrimination in schools, and creating gender responsive and inclusive social environments for student/youth wellbeing.

Course Fee: Php 9,000

LIMITED SLOTS ONLY! REGISTRATION GUIDELINES:

- Only those who achieved minimum passing grade in all subjects in the previous semester are eligible for registration. Registration fees are non-refundable.
- The training venues will be at the ESI Conference Room, Miriam College, Katipunan Avenue, Loyola Heights, Quezon City
- For Miriam College graduate students, the IWHRG and GFE courses can be credited as 3-unit academic courses upon the approval of their respective Department Chairs and the Registrar's Office.
