In accordance with DepEd Order No. 009, s. 2025, which amends DepEd Order No. 009, s. 2024 (Implementing Guidelines on the School Calendar and Activities for School Year 2024-2025), all participants involved in this activity shall be entitled to a three-day service credit for teaching personnel and compensatory time off for non-teaching personnel, in strict adherence to DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2003 (Updated Guidelines on the Grant of Vacation Service Credits to Teachers) and the Department of Budget and Management and Civil Service Commission Joint Circular No. 2, s. 2004 concerning non-monetary remuneration for overtime service rendered; moreover, ALS Contract of Service personnel shall receive overtime pay pursuant to

CSC and DBM Joint Circular No. 2, s. 2015, and CSC and DBM Joint Circular No. 1, s. 2015 regarding Policies and Guidelines on Overtime Services and Overtime Pay for Government Employees.
