**INFORMATION DISSEMINATION ON THE BEBRAS CHALLENGE –
PHILIPPINES FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2025-2026**

1. This Regional Office has received a letter-request from the Asian MathSci League, Inc. Philippines (AMSLI) dated October 1, 2025, inviting learners in the region to participate in the Bebras Challenge – Philippines for School Year 2025-2026. The Bebras Challenge is an international initiative that advances learners' understanding of informatics and computational thinking for students from Grades 2 to 12, co-organized with the National Olympiad for Informatics (NOI.ph).
2. The objectives of the Bebras Challenge are to:
 - a. Develop learners' computational thinking skills through problem-solving activities that involve decomposing complex tasks, designing algorithms, recognizing patterns, and applying abstraction;
 - b. Provide age-appropriate opportunities for students to engage with informatics in a recognized international setting;
 - c. Introduce a Team Round component for Grades 5-8 students in the Final Round to strengthen collaboration and strategic thinking skills.
3. Attached is the letter-request from AMSLI dated October 1, 2025, and the Bebras Challenge – Philippines General Guidelines for SY 2025-2026, containing complete information on registration procedures, schedules, fees, and mechanics of the competition.
4. The target participants are students from Grades 2 to 12 enrolled in public and private schools in the Caraga Region. The activity schedule is as follows:

In compliance with DepEd Order No. 9, s. 2005 (*Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith*), schools and learners who wish to participate must ensure that the activity does not interfere with regular class schedules and instructional hours. Participation must be conducted outside regular class time or during co-curricular periods, following school policies and calendars.
- c. In compliance with DepEd Order No. 8, s. 2013, this issuance is for **information dissemination only** and not for endorsement, per DepEd Order No. 28, s. 2001.
- d. Schools interested in participating as institutional partners may coordinate directly with AMSLI regarding package options and discounted rates, as indicated in the attached guidelines.

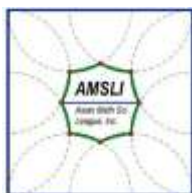

The Bebras Challenge is an international initiative aiming to promote Informatics (Computer Science, or Computing) and computational thinking among school students at all ages. Computational thinking involves using a set of problem-solving skills and techniques that software engineers use to write programs and apps. The Bebras challenge promotes problem solving skills and Informatics concepts including the ability to break down complex tasks into simpler components, algorithm design, pattern recognition, pattern generalization and abstraction.

CONTEST STRUCTURE AND SCHEDULE:

There will be two rounds: a **Preliminary Round** and a **Final Round (Individual, and Team)**.

- Students can participate in the **Preliminary Round** in one of three ways:
 - online,
 - in AMSLI centers (paper), or
 - in their school if registered as a BebrasPH partner school (online/paper).
- The **Final Round (Individual)** will be held ONLINE for all students. The final round is individual.
- A **Team Final Round** – a novel introduction this year – will be conducted ONLINE for *invited* Grades 5-8 students.
- The schedule is as follows. Changes in the schedule will be announced in the Bebras Facebook page and in the official Guidelines.

N.B. Registration deadlines will be strictly observed.

Changes in schedule:

- Subject to weather and government announcements, as well as changes in the AMSLI calendar, the Bebras Challenge schedule may be changed. Announcements will be done in the Bebras Website and AMSLI Facebook Group.
- If a student misses the competition date or time, there will be no make-up session for the Bebras Challenge Philippines.
- In case of conflict in school schedules (exam, school-sanctioned events) arising from changes in AMSLI calendar, please email bebrasph@gmail.com before the competition date and include official school document. Refunds will be considered on a case-to-case basis subject to a handling fee.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Students enrolled in a Philippine educational institution can join the Bebras Challenge - Philippines. The competition will be done based on the grade level, from Grades 1 to 12 (School year 2025-2026) are eligible to participate in the Bebras Contest. There is no age requirement to participate in the contest.

Students/teachers may be asked to provide a proof of enrolment upon request.

All AMEP and AIEP 2025-2026 students are entitled to a free registration for the Preliminary Round. They do NOT need to register individually since AMSLI will automatically register for them. However, to modify student details such as change of schools, inclusion of coach, please fill up the Google Form below.

Only Achievers in the Preliminary Round can participate in the individual Final Round. For the team Final Round, AMSLI reserves to have a different cut-off score. Only Grades 5-8 will have a team Final Round. Students joining the team round must also participate in the individual Final Round.

FEES:

Participation to the Bebras Challenge is VOLUNTARY.

All AMEP and AIEP 2025-2026 students are entitled to a free registration for the Preliminary Round.

The fee for the Preliminary Round is P350 (350 Philippine pesos). Payment will be done upon each registration. The fee for the Final Round (Individual) is P1000. The fee for the Final Round (Individual+Team) is P2200.

AMSLI centers and BebrasPH partner schools will enjoy discounts in the Preliminary round depending on the number of students joining.

Refunds to individuals will NOT be entertained except for refunds of at least P1000 and will be processed after each round. Fees already incurred will be deducted from the refund. Payment for registration is transferable to another existing registration. Such changes must be requested by answering the Google Form below.

There are no discounts or free registrations for the Final Round.

REGISTRATION PROCESS (Preliminary Round):

A. AMEP/AIEP 2025-2026 students

1. AMEP and AIEP 2025-2026 students are automatically registered to the Bebras Preliminary Round. Delayed payments or special arrangements with AMSLI centers will be entertained on case-to-case basis.
2. Students in the online class will receive their contest passes automatically. Their AMSLI mentors will brief them about Bebras.
3. Students in AMSLI centers will take the exam on paper, and will be informed by their AMSLI mentors. They will not receive any email.

B. For students enrolled in AMSLI-affiliated center

1. AMSLI-affiliated centers can contact the Bebras Philippines secretariat to register and enjoy discounts. The school will provide all details, will agree to terms and conditions on behalf of participating students, and pay for all students registered in this manner. The school reserves the right to choose the mode of the exam.

C. Student Registration for BebrasPH partner schools

1. Schools can register to be a BebrasPH partner school.

To register, schools must send an email to bebrasph@gmail.com and choose a package for their school (see below). School must settle the payment for their chosen package. AMSLI will facilitate registration and provide the other inclusions in the package by an agreed timeline.

To submit student details, schools will choose one of the following options.

- Schools can submit a Microsoft Excel file of students with required details (by registration deadline), or
- use online Bebras registration system: AMSLI will provide access codes after receipt of payment, and the schools can give each student a special access code to register individually.

2. Package inclusions and School responsibilities

A. Inclusions

1. Registration for the number of students included in chosen package. In excess of this, the charge will be proportional to effective price per student.
2. If choosing the Online option, teachers will also receive a 30-minute briefing on how to use the AMSLI portal for students. An AMSLI representative may also be available online during the competition for technical assistance.
3. If choosing the Paper option, paper copies of the contest will be delivered to the school. Schools will also receive 1 soft-copy of previous year's exam prior to the competition.
4. After the final round, schools will received a copy of one (1) set of questions of the preliminary round for each Bebras category registered, complete with solutions and discussion IF there are at least 10 students in that category. Note: BebrasPH follows the five categories: Grades 1-2, Grade 3-4, Grade 5-6, Grades 7-8, and Grades 9-12. The exam is the same per category, but ranking is done per grade level.
5. A report on the school performance, as well as a softcopy of their students' responses, at the end of the Bebras Competition.
6. Online certificates for students, coaches, and organizers (proctors).
7. Guarantee to have the top student per level to participate in the final round, with a limit of 15% of the school's representatives for each batch. AMSLI reserves the right to deliberate and enforce a cut-off score.

B. Responsibilities of BebrasPH partner school

1. Assign (a) pointperson/s to coordinate with AMSLI.
2. Pay the registration fee in full and on time.
3. Coordinate the competition schedule with AMSLI, and manage the competition within their school.



4. Provide teachers for proctors and conduct the contest in school premises. (AMSLI will not provide payment for the proctors and any other fees involved in organizing the competition).
5. Ensure the integrity of the competition by following AMSLI's rules and regulations.
6. Provide AMSLI with student responses in MS Excel form (if students take the exam in paper).

C. BebrasPH partner school Packages

1. Online: Students will take the exam online

3. Remarks:

- Students in BebrasPH partner schools registered for an online exam will receive emails like any individual registration. Schools registered for paper exam will not receive emails.
- BebrasPH partner schools and AMSLI centers may adjust the schedule as permitted by the logistics of their school. The preliminary round must be held within a week after the online exams.

D. Individual student registration

1. Registration can be done via bebras.amsliphil.com. A student can choose to take the exam online or onsite (an AMSLI center). The fee is fixed regardless of paper/online modality.

Once the registration is done, an email will be sent to each student informing them of the registration. The student then has 48 hours to pay and submit the proof of payment. To submit the proof of payment, please follow the steps as indicated in the email. A student is only considered officially registered if he has received a confirmation of payment by the deadline above. **Please make sure to provide a correct email address as this is the most common reason of not receiving our emails.**

Students will receive their contest passes (log-in details) 1-2 weeks after registration following the schedule above. Students taking the test online can try the mock exam.

2. Changes in the registration details (name, school, grade level, etc.) may be requested by answering the Googleform below.

3. AMSLI centers may organize onsite registration (for paper tests). These students will not receive an email unless they register for an online competition. Mock test are only available for online participants. AMSLI centers may have their own procedures in compliance with the Bebras Organizing committee. Please inquire with your nearest AMSLI center if they will organize a registration. Updates will also be updated in the online Bebras Guidelines (see link below).

REGISTRATION PROCESS (Final Round – Individual):

1. Registration can be done via bebras.amsliphil.com.

Once the registration is done, an email will be sent to each student informing them of the registration. The student then has 48 hours to pay and submit the proof of payment. To submit the proof of payment, please follow the steps as indicated in the email. A student is only considered officially registered if he has received a confirmation of payment by the deadline above.

Students will receive their contest passes following the schedule above. Students taking the test online can try the mock exam.

REGISTRATION PROCESS (Final Round – Team and Individual):

1. Registration can be done via bebras.amsliphil.com. Selected students must register using the Students+Team option. Students in the waitlist and invited to join the team will be informed of the registration process later on.

Once the registration is done, an email will be sent to each student informing them of the registration. The student then has 48 hours to pay and submit the proof of payment. To submit the proof of payment, please follow the steps as indicated in the email. A student is only considered officially registered if he has received a confirmation of payment by the deadline above.

Students will receive their contest passes following the schedule above. Students taking the test online can try the mock exam.

2. The team assignments will be randomly determined by AMSLI. After the individual Final Round, participants to the Final Round will be invited for a short briefing.



TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS:

For Students Taking the Preliminary Round Online:

A stable internet connection and a laptop with camera and microphone OR a tablet that can share the screen while on Zoom is required. **Please note that videos and audio is recorded during the Preliminary Round, so the laptop must be capable of such functions.**

AMSLI will not be held responsible for any problems arising from connectivity. The integrity of the competition will be prioritized, and thus sufficient technical requirements will be the responsibility of the student.

BebbrasPH partner schools may organize the competition online, and it will be their responsibility to provide equipment for their students.

For Students Taking the Preliminary Round in paper:

Students will only need to bring their pencils or pens, as well as their valid ID. Students may need to wear their school uniform or any appropriate attire in the contest venue.

AMSLI centers and BebrasPH partner schools who will conduct the Preliminary Round on paper will provide room and proctoring.

For the Final Round:

The final round will be held synchronous online. A stable internet connection and a laptop with camera and microphone OR a tablet that can share the screen while on Zoom is required. **Please note that videos and audio is recorded during the Final Round, so the laptop must be capable of such functions.**

For the final round, two devices may be required, one to answer the questions and a second one that will act as a camera and microphone. A stable internet connection is required.



CONTEST MECHANICS:

This is an individual competition. Students are not allowed to talk to anyone or consult any material throughout the duration of the competition, except for troubleshooting technical difficulties.

The Bebras Challenge consists of a set of 15 tasks of varying difficulty levels (easy, medium, or hard). The point system is as follows:

- Every correct answer is worth 3, 4, or 5 points, depending on the difficulty level
- 0 points for unanswered task
- $-1/4$ of the possible points for the specific task if the answer is incorrect.

The question pool consists of original contributions of AMSLI mentors and partners, as well as questions vetted by the international Bebras Community, selected and adapted for the Philippines Bebras Challenge by the National Olympiads in Informatics Philippines (NOI.ph). The questions type may vary as Multiple Choice, Short Answer, among others. The questions that will appear in the mock exam are also previous Bebras Challenge questions. No answer keys will be provided.

A. Preliminary Round

Login details will be sent to each registered student once payment is validated. They may use it to attempt to log into the examination portal during the mock exam. BebrasPH partner schools will also receive a copy of the mock exam after registration.

The Preliminary Round will be a 90-minute. The timer begins once students have entered the login credentials in the link provided.

1. For Students Taking the Preliminary Round Online:

Only the student must appear in the camera during the competitions. Parents may assist in setting up and logging in, but must leave the scope of the camera once the student logs in.

The camera and microphone must be on at all times – the proctor may turn the audio off if necessary. Screensharing must be on at all times. Students are allowed to use a whiteboard or a clean white sheet of paper for scratch work. Nothing else must be present on top of the desks of the students.

AMSLI reserves the right to disqualify students from the Final Round if there are any suspicious activities.

2. For Students Taking the Preliminary Round in paper:

Students must follow the rules provided by the proctors. Students are not allowed to raise questions to the proctors regarding the test questions, including the definition of words.

Students are allowed to use clean sheets of paper as scratch papers and must submit these scratch papers to the proctors after the test.



BebrasPH partner schools must comply with the guidelines for onsite testing, as indicated in the registration process above.

B. Final Round

Individual:

The qualifiers for the Final Round of the Bebras Challenge will be the top 20-40% (approximate) of the participants of that grade level, subject to a score cutoff per grade level decided by the BebrasPH Organizing Committee. In addition, BebrasPH partner schools will have assured slots for students to represent their school. AMSLI may impose a limit to the number of qualifiers to the Final Round.

The final round will be held synchronous (at the same time) via the online application Zoom. Students must be logged in at the specified time and may be required have two devices (one for answering, another as security camera).

The Final Round is the same as the Preliminary Round, except that the time limit will be shorter (60 minutes).

Team:

The qualifiers for the Final Round of the Bebras Challenge will be the top 25-40 (range is suggestive) students of the participants of each Grade level from Grades 5 to 8, subject to a score cutoff per grade level decided by the BebrasPH Organizing Committee. Each student will be randomly assigned to a team.

Each team will be given the body portion of three Bebras tasks, and they have 5 minutes to choose which task they will solve. They cannot change their choice. After choosing, the task will be provided, and the students will have a maximum of 60-90 minutes to answer the tasks and prepare their presentation. A task may contain more than one question.

The manner of presentation (video recording OR live as well as responding to questions from the judge) will be released together with the registration for the Final Round.

PRIZES AND AWARDS:

Each section of the Bebras Challenge - Philippines will have its own set of certificates and awards.

Preliminary Round:

The participants of the Preliminary Round will get *e-certificates* as follows:

- **Achiever Award:** All qualifiers to the Final Round depending on the cut-off determined by the Bebras Organizing Committee;
- **Distinction Award:** The Top 50% for each grade level, excluding those with the Achiever Award;
- **Certificate of Merit:** Top 75% for each grade level, excluding those with Achiever or Distinction Awards;
- **Certificate of Participation:** All participants who have not received the aforementioned awards.

Basic individual students' analysis of the preliminary round will also be provided to the students via e-mail in order to let them know their strengths and areas to improve on.

Coaches will receive an e-certificate via their emails. BebrasPH partner schools will receive a printed Certificate of Appreciation.

Final Round (Individual):

Participants in the Final Round, in addition to the e-certificate of Finals Participation, may receive the following awards given the score cutoffs to be determined based on the actual score, with approximate ratio:

- **Gold medal and printed certificate** - Top 15%
- **Silver medal and printed certificate** - Next 20%
- **Bronze medal and printed certificate** - Next 30%
- **E-certificates of Merit** - Next 35%

Coaches will also receive an e-certificate via their emails.

Final Round (Team):

Participants in the Final Round, in addition to the e-certificate of Finals Participation, may receive the following awards given the score cutoffs to be determined based on the actual score, with approximate ratio:

- **Gold medal and printed certificate** - Top 15%
- **Silver medal and printed certificate** - Next 20%
- **Bronze medal and printed certificate** - Next 30%
- **E-certificates of Merit** - Next 35%

Delivery (Final Round awards only):

- AMEP/AIEP students (non-online) – to be awarded during the AMEP/AIEP closing ceremony
- BebrasPH partner Schools and AMSLI centers – to be delivered to the school/center
- Public Schools – to be delivered to the respective Division Office of the school or the nearest AMSLI center
- Private schools outside NCR – to be delivered to the respective Division Office of the school or the nearest AMSLI center
- Private schools in NCR – to be delivered to the nearest AMSLI center or directly to the school
- Individual delivery – in certain cases, AMSLI will choose to delivery awards to the students directly.
- Special Individual delivery – Individuals may request for individual delivery at their own cost by filling in the Google Form to be announced in the Facebook Page of Bebras. These requests will be subject to the availability of the AMSLI staff to arrange the special delivery.

Delivery will only commence after the Final Awarding.

DATA PRIVACY:

AMSLI may use any information as provided in the registration process in running this competition and its related affairs (delivering awards, press releases, etc.). AMSLI will not disclose this information to unauthorized personnel. By registering and competing, the students or their guardian agree to the possible storage and usage of this information by both the School Coordinator and AMSLI. Students must agree that they may be recorded via pictures, video, screensharing, and audio, while the exams are ongoing.
